

He said that having a willingness to learn and getting comfortable with computers is the first step that can lead to having that confidence in the workplace. Congratulations!

Halaleh participated in both our computer skills program and our tutoring program. She contacted us when her current workplace (where she had been working as a PSW) was closing and all staff were being laid off. She felt that she needed computer skills training in order to find and maintain a new job. After finishing with the computer modules (Word and Excel), she was matched with a tutor to improve and gain more confidence in her writing skills so that she could enroll in the Medical Office Administration course at Herzing. Now, a year later, she has graduated with honours from that program and is working part-time in an office, with the plan to gain a full-time position in the future. 
